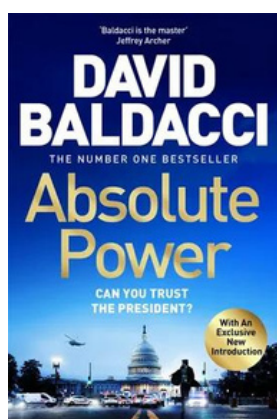
To survive, Isla Crown must lie, cheat, and betray. Even as love complicates everything . . .

The Women by Kristin Hannah

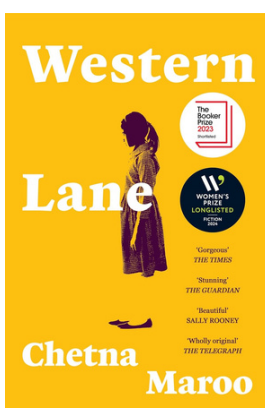

JOE GOLDBERG IS BACK . . .

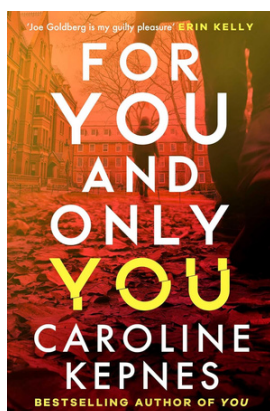

Thankfully, Wonder enters the picture. They have so much in common: no college degrees, no pretensions, just a love for literature...



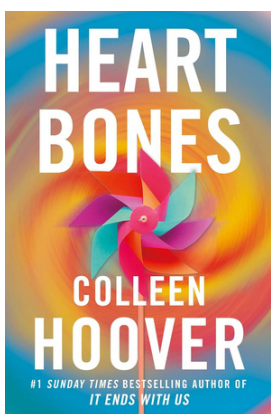
Betting on You by Lynn Painter

It Ends With Us (Book 1 of 2) by Colleen Hoover

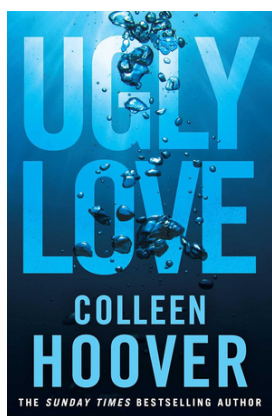

Never ask about the past.

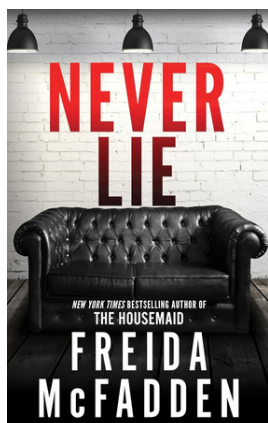

Never Lie by Freida McFadden

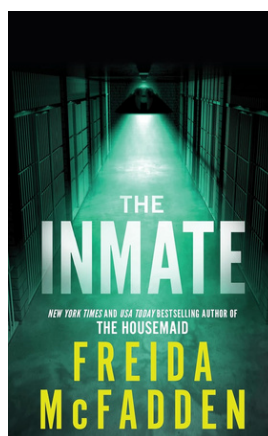

- 3) Never EVER become too friendly with the inmates.

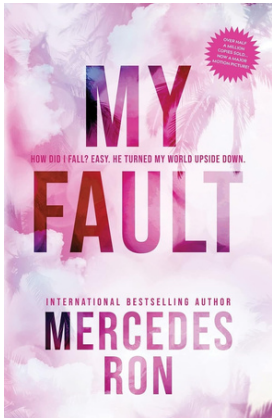

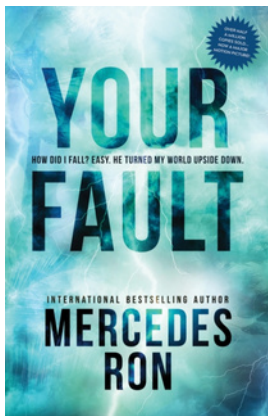

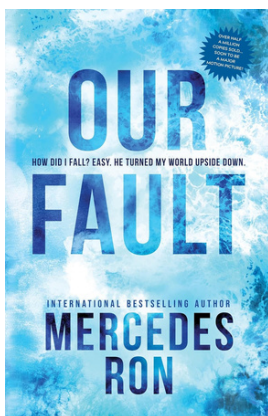

Margot went to college in South Carolina for a new start. It's a chance to get away – from her small town, her family and the memories of her dead best friend.

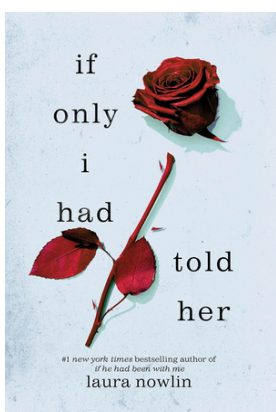

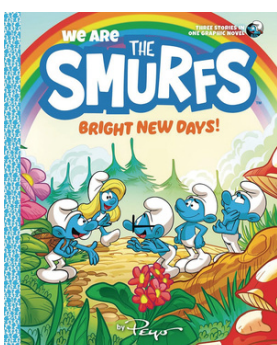

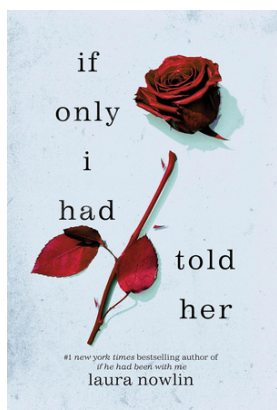
